### Methods and Sources of Academic Aid for Assignments

Students may...

yes no

- copy answers directly from another source
- use another source for guidance in completing assignments
- use another source to check that the process used to arrive at the answer is correct
- use another source to check that the answer arrived at is correct
- use solutions to unassigned problems as examples

Acceptable sources of aid include...

yes no

- former students' graded solutions (back-files)
- distributed solutions from previous semesters (back-files)
- solutions available online
- posting to online forums
- the solution manual (hard copy or electronic)

Acceptable methods of collaboration include...

yes no

- discussing assignments in groups
- working on assignments in groups
- multiple students contributing to all solutions
- combining the separate, independent work of multiple students

Students must list on their assignments...

yes no

- sources used (not including the course textbook, class notes, or TAs)
- all other students who collaborated on the assignment (when work is the same as the collaborator's)

### Use of Academic Aids for Exams

In preparation for exams, students may use...

- former students' graded exams
- answer keys distributed during previous semesters
- previous exam questions (without solutions)

Acceptable calculators for use on exams include...

- scientific calculator
- graphing calculator (e.g. TI-83(+), TI-84(+), TI-86)
- graphing calculator with computer algebra system (e.g. TI-89)

OR  No calculators will be allowed during exams

Acceptable aids for use during exams include...

- notes
- class textbook
- crib sheet
